Subject:- Labels & Leaflets requirements for pesticides and their  
formulations- reg-

Sir,

I have the honour to state that quite often the Secretariat of CIB & RC receives the representations from the Pesticide Industry stating that the Insecticides Inspectors/ concerned Licensing Officers in the State adopt a very restrictive interpretation of the legal provision and insist that a label affixed on the container should be at least in three languages including the local language. It is not always possible to satisfy this condition because of a large number of regional languages and the physical constraints of printing so many details in three different languages on retail packaging system.

The Registration Committee in one of its meetings decided that accompanied leaflets would be treated as an integral part of label as defined under section 3(b) of the Act and Rule 19(7) of the Insecticides Rules, 1971, to fulfil the labels and leaflets requirement. Therefore, to determine the satisfactory requirement of the labels and leaflets, it is necessary to read the labels and leaflets together. A model of label was approved by the Registration Committee which is enclosed herewith for your ready reference. The information which cannot be printed on the label due to the small size of the containers, can be printed on the leaflets.

You are, therefore, requested to instruct your Insecticides Inspectors/concerned officers in your State to adopt/implement the

decision of the Registration Committee and Insecticides stocks seized may be returned to the respective manufacturers.

Subject:- Label and Leaflet requirement in respect of small containers of pesticides - regarding.

Sir,

The Registration Committee has been receiving representations from time to time from the pesticide industry stating that on many occasions, State authorities initiate legal action against the manufacturers on the basis of information displayed only on the label without taking into consideration the information given in the accompanied leaflet. The issue was deliberated at greater length in a Meeting of Registration Committee in which the representatives of the Pesticide Industry were also present. The Registration Committee felt that all requisite information in the approved labels cannot be printed in the labels affixed on the small containers. Even if such information is given on the label in small size, the same would not be readable with naked eye. After thorough deliberations, the Registration Committee has decided that the accompanied leaflet with any container would be treated as an integral part of the label as defined under Section 3(b) of Rule 13(7) of the Insecticides Rules, 1971, to fulfil the label and leaflet requirements. A 'model label' (Annexure) for small containers of pesticides upto 250 ml capacity has also been approved together with compulsory details to be printed on it. The information which do not appear in this model label would be given in the accompanied leaflet.

2. It is requested that the above decision of the Registration Committee may be brought to the notice of all your members.


